## PARENT'S CORNER

A big welcome to all new parents and children that joined our nursery this academic year. We kindly ask that you read our guide below and feel free to contact us if you'd like more information on any of these points.

- Ensure your child has enough spare clothes (adjusted to weather needs) & label his/her belongings.
- Provide bedding that are clearly labelled in drawstring bag or back pack( not plastic bag) for your child (1 bed sheet and 1 blanket) every week.
- Please make sure that your child wears comfortable, easy to put on shoes. We're promoting independence by encouraging them to put shoes on/off by themselves but if too difficult this may cause frustration - no shoelaces, Velcro is a better option.
- If you would like your child to have her/his breakfast at nursery, make sure they arrive early, breakfast ends at 8.50am. This is to enable children to get ready for the day activities and routines.
- Remember to press the starfish room or office buzzer between 12pm and 2pm as the children are sleeping during this time.
- Please read the feedback information at the door so pick up times are smooth and rapid.
- We kindly ask all parents to support their child/ren at home with their self-independence, this includes using the toilet, potty training, dressing/undressing, self-feeding, wiping their nose and putting on their shoes.
- Just a reminder for you to brush your child's teeth twice a day at home (including babies).
- If your child was born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019, you must now apply for a Reception Class place in September 2023. We'll provide you with further information on how to apply as soon as we receive it. In the meantime, you can begin viewings/research your intending schools.



# CHILDREN'S LEARNING B B

#### **Children's learning for Autumn Term**

#### **Understanding the World:**

- Make links with personal experiences and represent those in role plays.
- Explore with small world toys and construction resources.
- Able to share feelings, thoughts and worries.
- Learn about winter animals and their habitats. We'll talk about food and healthy eating.

#### **Mathematics:**

- Identifying the number of the week and relating it to objects in the environment
- Encouraged to use mathematical language for comparison. Children will explore patterns while learning colours, size and shapes.
- Will have the opportunity to sort out objects during tidy up time.
- Explore nursery rhymes and songs that incorporate numbers/quantity.

#### **Expressive Arts & Design:**

- Create artwork/crafts while exploring with a wide range of media through sensory exploration by feeling, moulding, painting, sticking, etc.
- There will be opportunities to explore with sounds, rhythms, movement and space. The children will engage in imaginative role plays.

#### **Personal Social & Emotional Development:**

- Develop positive and secure attachments and relationships with their carers and peers.
- Provided with opportunities to share and take turns.
- Supported emotionally with room transitions and transition from home/nursery.
- Encouraged to be polite, have good manners, understand and follow nursery routines, rules and boundaries.
- Will become independent with self- care skills including personal and oral hygiene.

#### **Communication & Language:**

- Develop their communication through singing songs, listening to stories, word repetition, describing and use of action words.
- Encouraged to share thoughts and ask questions. Continue to play what's in the box game both in nursery and at home.
- Will have the opportunity to develop their concentration and attention when listening to stories, being involved in "surprise bag", "what's in the box" and "bucket game".

#### **Physical Development:**

- Learn to move their bodies in different ways & develop their fine & gross motor skills by taking part in a variety of activities and games e.g yoga stretches to support children's well being.
- Encouraged to do their best individually & as a team.
- Will have the opportunity to explore with space awareness and safety when using tools during activities such as cutting, moulding, cooking, printing, threading, fixing puzzles, etc.
- Will have the opportunity to explore with a variety of messy play (feeling textures) and sensory items (that incorporate light and sound).

#### Literacy:

- Explore books and will be encouraged to recall /retell personal experiences.
- Explore with letters and sounds in the alphabet.
- Explore with letter formation by mark making zig zag, wave and circle lines in paint, shaving foam, paper etc.
- Develop pencil control and eye-hand coordination while making marks with a purpose (shopping list, restaurants' menu, etc).
