- √ Always use please, thank you and excuse me
- ✓ Push in chairs

- ✓ Tell the teacher if someone hurts you



Attendance



Why should your child be on time?

- Daily attendance helps us to keep track of who is present and check on late/absent children
- Daily schedule helps the child settle into the school routine quickly and easily
- Morning circle time/registration Early morning circle time (9am) is one of the most important times of the day
- Timetable If your child is regularly late, they may be missing some classes as we work on a timetabling system and do not do every subject everyday
- •3-4 year olds Early morning is when most children are able to absorb a lot of information, this is the best learning time
- getting ready for school The daily routine of attending nursery will help your child transition to KG/FS1 in the coming year easily



Uniform

We have a double-sided apron that your child can wear over their regular clothes Why do we need the uniform?

- Gives a feeling of belonging
- Keeps clothes from becoming messy
- Recognition on trips
- Presentation
- Preparation for school uniform



Bus Regulations



- **Timings** please be ready for pick up and drop off times so that the drivers can be on time for other students
- **Seat belts** must be worn at all times
- Car Seats are recommended and must be supplied by the parent
- **Contact details** make sure the driver has your correct contact details and you have the driver's number in case of emergency
- Call if not attending saves the driver wasting time waiting for you
- **Rules** sitting still, no eating, no loud noises, respect the driver and the helper
- No Parents allowed on the buses



Smart boards & IT



What is a Smart board?

An electronic interactive board that can be used to draw, write, create pictures, move and play interactive games and watch short education programs, all electronically

Why do we use them?

In-keeping with our promise to be a green nursery, we try to use little paper and the children respond well to electronic learning. Electronic learning is becoming more and more part of the academic learning process in schools. We like to give our children a heads up in the IT world.

What other IT products do we use?

Children are introduced to remote controlled cars, walkie talkies, and digital cameras



Paperwork and files



Will there be paperwork?

We are a green nursery so we are trying to use as little paper as possible, while still exposing the children to the concept of papers, and use of pencils and coloring. Mostly we use dry erase markers that can be cleaned and used again and again

What will come home?

A few papers with art work or writing exercises. Most of the learning is done electronically or physically which can be seen on our social media and application

Pencil control and writing

In order to develop the fine motor skill of pencil control and writing, we do ensure that your child does some paperwork, along with finger writing, whiteboards, and magnetic boards






Files and documents

In order to keep as green as possible, we try to keep all notes and information on our application, so please make sure to check it daily.

- Virtual Portfolios for each child with notes and dates for each entry
- Unhealthy food notice
- Allergy alerts
- Extra clothing/diapers/wipes
- Water splash notification
- Parent conferences
- Invitations for events



Physical Notes that may come home:

- Trip permission slips
- Nurse note for lice/nails/unsuitable clothing
- Accident/incident form
- Report cards sent home when the child leaves



Learning through play

What is learning through play?

The difference between animals and humans is the range of symbols and speech that EXPLODES in the toddler years into language, dance, arts, music, drama, literature, science, and mathematical, critical and logical thinking

Free play allows creativity to develop rapidly

Allowing your child the time to explore and create will help imagination and develop creativity. Give guidelines, not direction, so they can explore on their own. This will enable your child to learn how things work and why things happen

Suggested play resources at home

- Play dough
- Blocks
- Plastic animals
- Paints/colors
- Lots of old paper/cardboard rolls/glitter/glue/tape anything that can be created into something by your child



Languages

- After 10 years, language development slowly shuts down
- Multilingual children may speak many languages by 6 years old
- Mother tongue language should <u>always</u> be used by at least one family member at home

What do we need to know

Parent/teacher meetings and appointments

 Special arranged meetings from the teacher/principal.

Your child's teacher or the principal may call you to arrange a meeting

What are the meetings for?

To discuss how your child is doing and any concerns or issues you or the nursery may have

 How do I speak to the teacher any other time?

By calling anytime to make an appointment with reception or in special event days, when the teacher will be available fo a short chat





Healthy Eating habits

Health and hygiene



Healthy snacks – please no chocolate, chips or cakes

- Washing hands- children must wash their hands before eating and after the toilet
- We are a nut and egg-free nursery
- •The nurse will check regularly for height and weight
- Daily exercise- will be performed in the morning
- Coughs and colds/viruses please keep your child at home if she/he has a fever, a runny nose or is generally not well
- •Incidents/accidents will be reported by the nurse with a courtesy call
- •Lice and nits if you find these on your child please shampoo and comb ASAP and keep your child home until they are totally gone
- •Sleeping needs- your child may nap during the day if required



Confidentiality

Our promise of confidentiality demands that any contact details, personal matters and concerns will **not** be shared outside the nursery

Behaviour/discipline

• Sleep - your child will be offered a chance to sleep in needed. Please ensure that your child is receiving enough sleep, as this effects behavior

• Biting/hitting - we have a strict policy of no hitting or biting and we will work with you and your child to prevent this if needed

Manners - we insist on use of manners and etiquette at all times

Kinds of discipline - we use positive reinforcement to encourage best behavior at all times

 Additional help – We may suggest a shadow/assistant to be with your child if their behavior is a danger to themselves or other children, or they find it had to concentrate and are disturbing the class constantly



Potty Training


- We have details on our website to help this process along and advice on how and when to start
