
- · Please can all parents securely close the front door behind them and not let anyone else into the building. Thank you

In French this term the children have learned about their families. We sang a song called 'J'aime ma famille' (I love my family). The children then drew pictures of their families for their portfolios and linked it to our French song. The children have also been learning about fruits and their names in French.
